5 Wine-stained woods

Vintner's Collection reuses wine-making materials from California's wine country. All of the vanities are made from straight, flat wine-stained oak staves that were used to flavor wine during the fermenting process. The submersion enhances the grain of the oak, which is then further protected with a low VOC finish. Salvaged wood is already seasoned, yielding a piece that is highly durable.

CASEGOODS

Samuelson Executive Vice President Michael Chalfin has noted a declining demand for casegoods focused on storage and an increased focus on multifunctionality, such as having a light, refrigerator, safe and wardrobe all-in-one. "Overall, we're seeing an increased demand for larger-scale, floor-to-ceiling pieces such as headboards connected to the nightstand with integrated reading lamps or TV stands built into a waterfall desk," he said. Samuelson President Lawrence Chalfin has noticed consistent demand for LED lighting that is incorporated into the casegoods themselves. "Technology integration is absolutely an industry standard at this point."
