- 6. Walls lined with red and white mosaic tiles create a dramatic effect in a corridor that leads to the events center.
- 7. A presidential suite has midcentury charm, thanks to a mix of brass and walnut touches and Saarinen furniture, while subtle red accents and expansive floor-toceiling windows add to the sense of place.
- 8. The red carpet-lined flight tubes (made famous in the 2002 movie Catch Me If You Can) take guests to the hotel, and JFK's JetBlue Terminal 5, beyond.
- 9. Grand stairs lead to the double-height prefunction space of the events center, which, because it is located 29 feet below ground and the water level is 8 feet deep, required 2,000 gallons of water to be pumped out every minute for eight months during construction.
