Mashika Gallo to Receive Samuelson Furniture Ageless Living Collaborative Senior Living Design Scholarship

• The Ageless Living Collaborative (ALC) announced the recipient of the first ALC scholarship offered specifically to students dedicated to senior living design.

Mashika Gallo, a graduate student in Healthcare Design and Gerontology at Kent State University, in Ohio, is the first recipient of the Ageless Living Collaborative Senior Living Design Scholarship. Sponsored by Samuelson Furniture, Gallo receives a \$10,000 scholarship to be used for tuition against her current studies. An official ceremony and presentation will take place at the Gold Key Awards, Nov. 14 during the BDNY show.
